Why Say Hello?

KEY SCRIPTURE

How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" -Romans 10:14-15

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Say Hello journey! You are about to discover the important role you play in God's mission to make His truth known among Muslims. Anticipate God-sized surprises along the way!

VIDEO NOTES:

REFLECTION / RESPONSE

In this session, you heard Akan say that although she lived her whole life around Muslims, she never thought that she could say "hello" to even one of them.

1. Can you relate to Akan's story in any way? If so, how?

2. Read Romans 10:14-15, a familiar verse that speaks about lost people who have never heard about Jesus as well as how God feels about people who share God's Good News with them. How does this verse speak to you?



CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

Reflect on the statement that "Christian women like you are every Muslim woman's **best, if not only**, hope for heaven." Apply your thoughts to your personal sense of calling, and share them with Jesus in a prayer you write to Him, here.



UNIT 1 MODULE 1.2

When a Muslim friend experiences Jesus through you, she will have the opportunity to become a daughter of God.



Who Is the Muslim Woman?

KEY SCRIPTURE

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. -Romans 5:8

INTRODUCTION

Muslim women are like any daughters, sisters, and mothers in the world who value family, virtue, opportunity, security, and happiness—and seek those things in every way they know how. What they do not know is the truth about Jesus.

VIDEO NOTES:



REFLECTION / RESPONSE

1. Muslim daughters, sisters and mothers are more like you than you think. The biggest difference is that they do not know the truth about Jesus. What does this statement make you think and/or how does it affect you emotionally?

2. List some of your fears, insecurities, hopes, and joys. Which ones do you think Muslim women might relate to as well?

3. In this session, you heard that Muslim women who come to Jesus are most often drawn to Christ's love. What do you think that love looks like? Read Romans 5:8 to be reminded that while we were still sinners, God already loved us absolutely. Yes, THAT much!

CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

With a grateful heart, ask Jesus to give you the privilege of sharing this truth with Muslim friends. Write your prayer in the space provided.

Where Is the Muslim Woman?

KEY SCRIPTURE

For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost. -Luke 19:10

INTRODUCTION

God is bringing Muslim women into our communities so they can more easily hear about Jesus and who He truly is!

VIDEO NOTES:

REFLECTION / RESPONSE

1. Take the next five minutes to go online and research where Muslims might live in your community. Use an app like Google Maps to look up local mosques, Muslim community centers, or Muslim-owned restaurants in your city.

2. Make a list of these locations, then commit to praying for the people who visit these places this week. (You might try eating there, too!)

3. Can't find anything in your city? No problem! Take a couple more moments and look for influential Muslim women online. You can search specifically for female Muslim authors, for example, or female Muslim politicians, or female Muslim athletes, etc. Make a list of their names and commit to praying for them, as well.

CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

What will the prayers you pray for these locations and people look like? Begin by thanking the Lord for Muslims in your community in as many ways as you can. Take the time to write your research-based prayer here.



UNIT 1 MODULE 1.4

God is giving Muslims greater access to the truth about Jesus by moving them and us into shared spaces all over the world.



Why Is the Muslim Woman My Neighbor?

KEY SCRIPTURE

From one man he made all the people of the world. Now they live all over the earth. He decided exactly when they should live. And he decided exactly where they should live. God did this so that people would seek him. And perhaps they would reach out for him and find him. They would find him even though he is not far from any of us. -Acts 17:26-27 (NIRV)

INTRODUCTION

God decides when and where you should live, and when and where your Muslim neighbor should live. He does this so that everyone can find out who He really is. The way He involves Himself in the details of our lives continually reveals His great love for us and His massive plan to redeem lost people.

VIDEO NOTES:

REFLECTION / RESPONSE

1. Have you ever really thought about this verse before now?

2. How did God involve himself in the details of your life to help you find Him?

3. Was there a person He used in your salvation story? How so?

4. How might God be ordering the times and places where you live to help Muslims find Him?



CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

Now, take a moment and tell the Lord how you feel about Muslims. If you are ready, ask God to bring you a Muslim friend with whom you might be able to share Christ's love and the truth about who He is. Journal your prayer here.



UNIT 1 MODULE 1.5

Remember that Satan builds the walls that keep Muslims isolated from the gospel, but one of the great joys of outreach to Muslims is getting to see Jesus crumble these barriers.



What to Do with Fear of Talking to Muslim Women

KEY SCRIPTURE

I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears. -Psalm 34:4

INTRODUCTION

Fear is one of the main tactics Satan uses to keep Christians from sharing Jesus with Muslims. It has been an especially strong deterrent since 9-11, hasn't it? For many, it's natural to fear things that might be dangerous or confusing, but God graciously desires for us to be honest with Him and simply lay those fears at His feet.

VIDEO NOTES:

REFLECTION / RESPONSE

1. Have you ever felt afraid of Muslims? If so, how?

2. How did Ananias respond when God first told him to seek out Saul, who had been terrorizing Christians? When God prompted him a second time, how did he respond?

3. Ephesians 2:14-16 reminds us that God is our peace, who breaks down walls. Are there walls of fear in your life that you'd like to see God crumble?

CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

Are you ready to surrender your fears or hesitancies so that God can use you to reach lost Muslims? Tell Jesus about it in writing, here.

UNIT 1 MODULE 1.6

If the Holy Spirit can anoint a whole sermon, he can certainly anoint my simple hello.



What Can I Do to Begin My Say Hello Journey?

KEY SCRIPTURE

The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners. -Isaiah 61:1

INTRODUCTION

So now it is time to begin! It's time for us to believe that God has anointed us for the task and will give us everything we need to share His love with the Muslim women He brings our way.

VIDEO NOTES:

REFLECTION / RESPONSE

1. How does Isaiah 61:1 apply personally to you and a Muslim God brings your way?

2. Click or scan the QR code to access the "Praying for Muslim Women" PDF and the "Prayer Walking Guide" PDF downloads. Do you have a Christian friend who will walk this path with you? If not, pray about who you might invite to join you in this endeavor.

3. Set aside some time this week to pray for the Muslim community in your area. In the space below, jot down a plan for prayer-walking where your Muslim neighbors might live, shop, eat, go to school, etc.



CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

It is no accident that you are here. Be encouraged! Open your eyes to see Jesus at work in all the moments you have with your Muslim friend, because every encounter counts! God might be preparing you today for the Muslim woman He will bring your way tomorrow! 




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UNIT 2 MODULE 2.1

You don't have to be a Bible expert to share your faith with people, but you really must know what you believe and why.



Conflicting Creeds

KEY SCRIPTURE

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. -1 Peter 3:15

INTRODUCTION

People wrongly assume that Muslims and Christians share core beliefs. You will soon understand how Islam counterfeits the truths of Scripture. Although you don't have to be a Bible expert to share your faith with lost people, you really must know what you believe and why. The 20-century-old Apostles' Creed encapsulates the tenets of our faith. Please Click or scan the QR code to access the "Apostles' Creed" PDF download and follow along prayerfully as we move on.

1. Part of our motivation for keeping the Apostles' Creed at the forefront is Peter's exhortation in 1 Peter 3:15. What does this verse say to you, personally?

2. How might you use the Apostles' Creed in your daily life to develop practices that help know what you believe and why?

3. If you had to put the Apostles' Creed in your own words, what would they be?

The Apostles' Creed is a declaration that you can use as a tool to intercede for Muslims. Take a moment to pray the prayer below out loud, as a personal expression of your desire for them to know the truth about Jesus like you do. If you already have a Muslim friend, insert their name into the prayer as well.

Father God,

Help Muslims believe that you are God, the Father Almighty, creator

of heaven and earth. Help me point Muslims to belief in Jesus Christ,

Your only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and

born of the virgin Mary.

Help them to understand and accept that Jesus suffered under

Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into

hell. On the third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended to

heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty.

From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Help Muslims believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Church, the

communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins [through Jesus alone],

the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.

Amen.



UNIT 2 MODULE 2.2

It is very important that we clearly distinguish Islam from Muslims. Islam is a counterfeit religion, but Muslims are people who are created in the image of God and follow the religion of Islam.



Five W's: Learning about Islam

KEY SCRIPTURE

So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. -Genesis 1:27

INTRODUCTION

This lesson will give you a useful peek into the what, who, when, where, and why of Islam. It will be helpful for you to be familiar with these basic facts.

VIDEO NOTES:

What is Islam? Islam is a religion that states that there is no God but Allah

and Muhammad is his prophet.

Who are Muslims? Muslims are people who follow the religion of Islam.

When did Islam start? Islam started approximately 600 years after Christ.

Where is it from and where is it going? The Prophet Muhammad was born

in Mecca, Saudia Arabia, in 570 A.D. Islam has a growing presence in all but

40 of the world's nations.

Why does Islam thrive? The heart and strength of Islam come from its

ummah, or community connectedness.

1. Read Genesis 1:27 then reflect on how Muslim people are made in the image of God. How does this scripture impact the way you view them?

2. Click or scan the QR code to access the "Five W's of Islam" PDF download. Take a moment to review it.

3. What parts of what you have learned at this early stage suggest that Islam is a false religion?



Now that you understand the critical difference between the words *Islam* and *Muslim*, take amoment to reflect and write a prayer asking God to help you see and love Muslims the way He does.



UNIT 2 MODULE 2.3

Islam is a works-based religion. It teaches that Muslims must earn their way to Islam's paradise.



Islam's Law and Pillars

KEY SCRIPTURE

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. -Ephesians 2:8-9

INTRODUCTION

Have you heard of Islam's five pillars before today? Because they are so foundational to Islam's works-based theology, take a minute to review each of these pillars

VIDEO NOTES:

• Shahada: Islam's creed declaring that "There is no God but Allah and

Muhammad is his prophet."

- Salat: Obligatory prayer five times a day, using all the correct protocols
- Zakat: The giving of at least 2-2.5% of their income to charity
- Sawm: The obligation to fast food, water, and sexual relations from sun
- up to sundown, during the month of Ramadan
- Hajj: Islam's required one-time spiritual pilgrimage to Mecca, should

finances permit

- Jihad: sometimes called the sixth pillar
 - Greater jihad: one's inner struggles
 - Lesser jihad: combat in the defense or spreading of Islam

1. Click or scan to review the "Five Pillars" PDF download. According to Islam's teachings, what is the purpose of these pillars?

2. In your own words, according to Ephesians 2:8-9, how are Christians saved?

3. Although some of Islam's pillars resemble important Christian practices, our motivation behind them is not the same. What is the difference?

4. Why do you think it is important to understand this difference?

This would be a great time to thank your heavenly Father for His free gift of salvation and the personal relationship you get to have with Him. Consider putting your gratitude in writing, as a memory marker for you along this Say Hello journey.



UNIT 2 MODULE 2.4

The fact that the prophet Muhammad lived life around Christians and Jews accounts for the visible influences Judaism and Christianity had on Islam's early development. From the start, these elements have been manipulated to fit Islam's long-term agenda.



Islam's Beliefs

KEY SCRIPTURE

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. -John 3:16

INTRODUCTION

During this session you learned more about what Muslims believe. Now you understand more about Allah, his angels, the jinn, and Satan. Muslims believe in many books and messengers—some being distorted versions of narratives and Bible characters that are very familiar to Christians. In Islam, Jesus gets relegated to the role of prophet, but not the Son of God.

1. This lesson contains some statements that could be jolting to a Jesusfollower. How do the following beliefs differ from what the Bible teaches?

- Allah loves the Muslim's good deeds, but he hates the sinner.
- Most of hell's inhabitants are women.
- Jesus was a Muslim prophet.

2. John 3:16 and Romans 10:9-10 encapsulate what one must do and believe to be saved. These verses host the most fundamental of our beliefs. Sadly, Islam denies the deity of Christ and that He died for our sins, was buried, and arose again. What is your gut response to this denial? How important is it to focus on helping Muslims know the truth about Jesus?

3. To understand more about the main differences between Christian and Muslim beliefs, click or scan the QR code to explore the "Compare and Contrast of Beliefs" PDF download.



All this will help you in your preparation for the spiritual conversations you hope to have with Muslims.



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UNIT 3 MODULE 3.1

From now on, no matter where you see a veiled Muslim woman, remember that her veil represents much more than you originally thought.



Her Veil, Islam's Modesty

KEY SCRIPTURE

And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate [reflect] the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with everincreasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit. -2 Corinthians 3:18

INTRODUCTION

You might be surprised to know that many Muslim women love fashion like you do. Veils can be a very fashionable part of their attire, but the main reason Muslim women wear them is to obey Islam's mandates and reflect well on their community.

We have just now learned about the different kinds of veils, why some Muslim women choose to veil, and why other Muslim women choose not to veil.

1. To broaden your perspective further, enter "Muslim modest fashion" into a online search. How is the *burga* different from the *hijab*, and what do these differences communicate?

2. How might the type of veil your Muslim friend wears influence your interactions with her?

3. Now read 2 Corinthians 3:18. What stands out to you in this verse? What has Jesus done for you, and what might your "unveiled face" communicate to a Muslim friend?

God makes you a reflection of His glory as He continuously transforms you into His image. Prayerfully thank Him for so generously using you to help others see Him more clearly. Talk to Him about your desire to mirror God's image in the friendships you have with Muslim friends.



UNIT 3 MODULE 3.2

The Muslim woman's veil represents the righteous working of Islam's modesty. In that way, she becomes the keeper of her comunity's honor.



Islam's Modesty: More Than a Head Covering

KEY SCRIPTURE

I delight greatly in the Lord; ... For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness. -Isaiah 61:10a


INTRODUCTION

The prophet Muhammad said that "modesty is the character of Islam" (Ibn Maja 4182). The religious practice of purdah (i.e. the veiling of women and gender segregation) is Islam's means of ensuring modesty and upholding honor.

1. Can you recall what the practice of *purdah* requires? How is it about more than a head-covering?

2. In your own words, reflect on the practice of *purdah* and how you think it fits into the Prophet Muhammad's comment about modesty being the character of Islam. Does it trouble you?

3. How does Islam's veil image differ from what Isaiah 61:10a calls "garments of salvation" and "a robe of his righteousness?"



Meditate on Isaiah 61:10a and the way God clothes you in these emblems of His grace. Delight in the Lord with words that express worship and gratitude to Him. Then think about Muslim women, and ask the Lord to show you how you might share your joy with the Muslim friends you have or hope to have in the future.



UNIT 3 MODULE 3.3

The original mandates of veiling in Islam are included in Islam's sacred texts.



Purdah's Beginnings

KEY SCRIPTURE

Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible ... I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings. -1 Corinthians 9:19-23

INTRODUCTION

As you become familiar with Islam's edicts for veiling, you will have a better feel for how legally binding they are, and you'll understand the important role Muslim women have as modesty bearers in Islam.

1. Of the three Qur'anic veiling mandates we shared with you, which stands out the most? Why?

2. Do you recall the two valid interpretations of what Islam's veiling represents even today? Why is it important that you understand both?

3. Christians value modesty, too. Compare the Qur'an's modesty edicts with 1 Corinthians 6:19-20: "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore, honor God with your bodies."

Modesty matters, doesn't it? Be prepared. The Lord might ask you to make some personal adjustments to your own modesty practices as you share life with Muslim friends (1 Corinthians 9:19-23). Take the next few minutes to ask the Lord to help you to honor Him (and them) with your body, especially as you relate His Good News to them.



UNIT 3 MODULE 3.4

Many Muslims equate the West and Christianity with immodest, ungodly behavior, but you get to show them what it means to live life with Jesus at the center!



What Matters Today

KEY SCRIPTURE

Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. -Ephesians 5:1-2

INTRODUCTION

Modesty matters. It might be a lot about veiling and clothing to some people and more about behavior to others. But the Prophet Muhammad, having called modesty "the character of Islam", makes it central to how Muslims live. A Muslim's modesty is largely connected to the merit one receives for good deeds and the reward of Paradise.

1. Were you surprised to find out that Muslims typically believe Christians are promiscuous and do not value modesty? What cultural influences have helped foster this belief among them?

2. Of the modesty-related suggestions shared in this session, which ones stand out to you? Which ones might be harder or easier for you?

3. In the video you heard that "our friendships with Muslims develop more naturally when we conscientiously consider not only what we think it means to be modest but also what they believe modesty requires." Jot down some thoughts about how you think this could play out in your friendships.

The video warned against trying to emulate the prophet Muhammad in order to fit in with our Muslim friends. Remember, that's what Muslims must do. With this in mind, read Ephesians 5:1-2 out loud. Isn't it great that we get to imitate Jesus (1 John 4:19) in our friendships with Muslims? Thank God for His example and ask Him to empower you to walk in the way of love.





UNIT 3 MODULE 3.5

The crux of biblical modesty is putting on Jesus!



Biblical Modesty

KEY SCRIPTURE

But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. -Romans 13:14 (ESV)

INTRODUCTION

Jesus-followers have the privilege of understanding God's law through the lens of God's love. God first mentioned His Good News plan in His response to Adam and Eve's original sin (Genesis 3:15). Right then, already, He had Jesus on His mind. Jesus remains the crux of God's redemptive plan. He is the key to our understanding of biblical modesty. When we put on Jesus, He's the One who shines through us—the one Muslims get to see.

With Muslim women in mind, read 2 Corinthians 5:21, Ephesians 2:8-9, and Ephesians 4:24.

1. Has your personal understanding of modesty ever been based on rules and works? How is that different from biblical modesty?

2. How does biblical modesty fit into the broader scope of true righteousness and holiness?

3. How are these three scriptures good news to the Muslim woman?

Re-center on the essence of Genesis 3:15. It gives us our first peek into God's redemptive plan for all people. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you "put on Jesus" and best reflect His glory to Muslim women and anyone else He might bring your way.



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UNIT 4 MODULE 4.1

God has strategically ensured the relevance of biblical truth to all cultures.



Her Worldview: Shame/Honor

KEY SCRIPTURE

"To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some." -I Corinthians 9:22b

INTRODUCTION

A worldview is the shared framework of ideas held by a society concerning how they typically perceive the world. Cultural anthropologists break the concept of worldview into three general societal categories: guilt/innocence, shame/honor, and fear/power. Because Islam was birthed in a shame/honor cultural context, most Muslims identify with that worldview.

1. Click or scan the QR code to access the "Worldview" PDF download. Familiarize yourself with the different worldviews and think about which one you identify with the most.

2. Do you think that your worldview is the best? Is that ok?

3. In 1 Corinthians 9:22 Paul talks about becoming all things to all people in order to save some. Take a minute to read this verse and think it over. How might this apply specifically to our friendships with Muslim women in their shame/honor contexts?



Ask God to help you notice the ways He has strategically ensured the relevance of biblical truth to all cultures. Next, ask Him to help you live out the Apostle Paul's challenge to become all things to your Muslim friends, in order that they might be saved.



UNIT 4 MODULE 4.2

The overall ethos of Islamic law and practice makes many Muslim women vulnerable to gender-based shame. Jesus' way is very different.



A Muslim Woman's Vulnerabilities to Shame

KEY SCRIPTURE

Aware of this, Jesus said to them, "Why are you bothering this woman? She has done a beautiful thing to me.... Truly I tell you, wherever this gospel is preached throughout the world, what she has done will also be told, in memory of her." -Matthew 26:10-13

INTRODUCTION

Islam's sacred texts anchor and expose a Muslim woman's vulnerabilities to shame pertaining to her inherent worth and intelligence. "In contrast, Jesus lets women know they are intelligent and intrinsically worthy of God's love and concern. Not one time in all four Gospels did He put down a woman" (Doug Clark, Jesus and Women).

1. What are your initial reactions to the topics of male guardianship, the preference of sons over daughters, and the value of a woman's testimony in court? Can you relate to them in any way?

2. Take time to read the story in Matthew 26:6-13 about the woman who anointed Jesus with very expensive perfume. List all the ways her behavior would have been seen as culturally shameful.

3. In contrast, how does Jesus' response honor her?

Click or scan the QR code to access the "Pick a Country" PDF download. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you a Muslim country for which to intercede. Pray that Muslim women in that country will come to know Jesus like the woman of Matthew 26 knew Him.



UNIT 4 MODULE 4.3

Muslim women experience vulnerabilities to shame that reflect specifically on their femininity. Jesus honors their womanhood.



Her Femininity

KEY SCRIPTURE

He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering." -Mark 5:34

INTRODUCTION

In the last two lessons, we heard about some of the more difficult aspects of Islam and Muslim women's vulnerabilities to shame. In contrast, "Jesus was sensitive to the social and religious [challenges] with which women had to struggle, and He lifted those burdens." -Doug Clark. 1. What are some of the things you have heard for the first time in this study? Are you surprised by any of them?

2. List the names of all the women listed in Jesus' genealogy (Matthew 1). In what ways did they suffer vulnerabilities that are similar to those you've heard about in this session?

3. Read the story in Mark 5:25-34 about the woman with the issue of blood. List all the ways (physical, social, and emotional) you think she may have suffered.

4. In contrast, how did her encounter with Jesus change everything?

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These topics are heavy. Take a few minutes to prayerfully process your feelings. As you discern the impact Islam has on a Muslim woman's femininity and her vulnerabilities to shame, ask the Holy Spirit to help you love Muslims the way He does. Remember that Jesus is always the way to freedom from such suffering.



UNIT 4 MODULE 4.4

Islam mandates marriage for most people. Jesus values all women, whether they are married or not.



About Marriage and Singleness

KEY SCRIPTURE

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel (which means God with us). -Matthew 1:23

INTRODUCTION

Many Muslim women's shame-related life concerns are rooted in singleness and marriage. Islam's sacred texts prescribe that Muslims marry to protect them from sexual sin.

1. Read Matthew 1:18-24. Imagine the difficulties Mary must have faced when she, as a young girl who was betrothed but still single, learned that God had selected her to birth the Messiah. Did the fact that she was pregnant with Immanuel, God with us, make things any easier for her? How might her vulnerabilities to shame compare to what Muslim women experience even today?

2. How might Mary's narrative encourage you in your friendships with Muslims and others who are vulnerable to societal shame?

3. What does the word "honor" mean to you? Describe it in your own words.

4. List some ways you, as either a single or married woman, might develop elements of honor in your friendships with Muslims?

Mary, the mother of Christ, is a powerful example of a woman who experienced and overcame vulnerabilities to crippling shame in her transition from singleness to married life. This would be a good time to talk to God about your own shame-based struggles. Then take a moment to thank Him for Mary's example, and ask Him to help you bless Muslim women who suffer similar kinds of shame.



UNIT 4 MODULE 4.5

Islam highly esteems motherhood, but it diminishes the worth of women who are barren or fail to have male children. Jesus values and has a purpose for all women.



About Motherhood, Barrenness and More

KEY SCRIPTURE

Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in Him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." -John 4:39

INTRODUCTION

Muslim women aren't the only ones who experience heartbreak in marriage, motherhood, barrenness, and other matters of self-worth. Many of us identify closely with the deep pain of these kinds of disappointments, but God's intentions for His daughters are full of Kingdom purpose and worth.

1. Compare/contrast Allah's esteem for motherhood with our Heavenly Father's love for all women. How does this exercise motivate you going forward?

2. Read John 4:5-30 with the Muslim woman in mind. What happens to her at the well?

3. How does Jesus make the Samaritan woman a valuable part of His greater mission to all humanity?





Take some time to verbalize how grateful you are to serve a God who loves all women, and thank Him for including the story of the Samaritan woman in His Word. Reflect on the purpose God has for your life, particularly in relationships with Muslim women. KEY SCRIPTURE

My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? -John 14:2


INTRODUCTION

Islam teaches that hospitality is a way to earn merit with Allah, while the entire biblical narrative is a grand story of hospitality! Christ's presence in the context of hospitality creates sacred space for supernatural things to happen.

1. When you hear the word hospitality, what sort of things come to your mind?

2. Read John 14:2. Before today, had you ever thought about how hospitality has always been central to the mission of God?

3. In the video, we heard that according to the Qur'an and the Hadith, hospitality, like every other good deed that would be expected of a Muslim, is mainly a matter of obedience and merit. In what way is this different from how a Jesus follower views hospitality?



Our goal in relationships with Muslims is that they get to taste and see the wonder of God's hospitality through us. Take a few moments to talk to God about how He might use you to welcome your Muslim friends into a relationship with Him.



UNIT 5 MODULE 5.2

Hospitality is a frame of heart and mind.





KEY SCRIPTURE

Freely you have received; freely give. -Matthew 10:8b

INTRODUCTION

When you receive a Muslim friend's generous hospitality, you'll experience the best she has to give. Perhaps when she receives your hospitality, she'll be able to experience Jesus, whose "best" can mean heaven for her.

1. List some ways that God gives you His best, is always ready, and makes sure you have more than enough. How might you pass your gratitude forward in your friendships with Muslims?

2. Jesus made sure that the wedding guests in Cana had the best wine. How did that reflect upon the bridegroom? How might your hospitality reflect Christ?

3. How can letting a Muslim friend know that you are a Christian early on be a form of generosity that builds trust and opportunity in your relationship?

Biblical hospitality always features the joy of generous sharing. Take a moment to thank God for specific people in your life whose hospitality has drawn you closer to Jesus. Then ask the Lord to help you share hospitality unsparingly, in ways that mirror God's supreme love to your Muslim friends.



UNIT 5 MODULE 5.3

The Holy Spirit invites and empowers us to extend God's hospitality to Muslim friends.



What We Get to Do

KEY SCRIPTURE

The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God. -Leviticus 19:34

INTRODUCTION

Hospitality builds trust and enriches friendships. It breaks down stereotypes and fears, and it creates space for sharing faith. It models God's love and welcomes His presence where He might otherwise never be expected or known. In your hospitality, Muslims will be able to perceive that you are a devout follower of Jesus.

You will encounter all kinds of Muslims-immigrants as well as those who who were born in your country. In this lesson, the focus on Islam's protocols for hospitality will guide you as you get to know your Muslim friends. Putting them first in your hospitality honors God, them, and you.

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CALL TO ACTION PRAYER

Ask the Lord to help you see how your hospitality might create space for Him to show himself strong. Reflect on the do's and don'ts you are learning about. Finally, ask Him to guide you in these kinds of opportunities, and to give you courage to pray with your Muslim friends.

Guesting and Hosting

KEY SCRIPTURE

Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people. -Luke 1:68, (ESV)

INTRODUCTION

Luke 1 records Zachariah's song in which he prophesies Jesus' visit to earth to redeem humankind. Whether you are a guest or a host, you have the opportunity to invite Jesus into your encounters so that, ultimately, your Muslim friends might experience His redemption.
